Dear Parents & Carers,

The children have started to settle into their learning and have been enjoying the topics they have started.

CROSS COUNTRY

Well done to all of the children who took part in the Link Academy Cross Country at Stover School. Over 500 children took part from 16 schools and all of the children from Cheriton Bishop School were a credit to themselves and the school. They cheered and supported each other all the way round a very challenging course. Well done everyone!
